Total raised was an amazing £1200 for Outdoor and Community Curriculum!



Parents/Carers are really embracing the opportunity to snap a picture of their child reading which is opening up conversations between our students and their adults at home about reading and this is always a productive thing!



We made no cook chocolate and mint coconut snowball biscuits- otherwise known as Mint surprises!








We set up an igloo for a reading den and everyone enjoyed time to look at books sat inside.

Children can engage in:


- Practical tasks (cooking, housework and shopping)

School Dinner Ordering


