

Elm Class

Year 9 Elm Class on the Rowde campus were so moved by the plight of Turkish civilians after the devastating Earthquake that they put pens to paper and wrote letters of support and sympathy. It was readily decided to write letters in English class, using their literacy skills that conveyed support and consolation.

Year 9 students expressed their frustration at being so far away and conveyed their sympathy in words. They wished the Turkish people hope and restoration.

They wanted to assure people suffering in the wake of the earthquake that they were very much at the forefront of their thoughts and that their friends, so very far away in rural Wiltshire; irrelevant of the geographical distance, this did not provide a barrier in feeling very 'close' to the people of Turkey.



It is moments like this where Silverwood students really do embrace and embody the school's core values where *Kindness* really did shine through their amazing sentiments.

Letters were sent to both the Turkish Embassy in London and the British Embassy in Ankara, Turkey.

A few short weeks later and Elm class received a response from the Consul General Mr B. Utku Atakan from the Consulate of the Republic of Turkey in London. He wrote individual letters to all the students who had written their letters, addressing each of the items that had been discussed and took note of the sentiments that had been conveyed by each student.

It was a very moving response and the Consul General wanted to extend his gratitude to the students at Silverwood School for their sensitivity. He stated that "each of the letters is full of affection and hope". The Consul General wrote that "distance and difference do not matter" and that the people of Turkey "could feel your support and prayers".

The Consul personally signed each of the letters. Well done to Elm class, Year 9.



Willow Class

Last term in Willow Class we were doing lots of work about Earth and Space. We wrote poems and found out about space travel. We even invented out own planets and made models of them in art.







This term we have been reading the book Dear Greenpeace and have been writing letters. Mr Melrose answered our letters asking questions about caring for the animals.






Parrots Class


